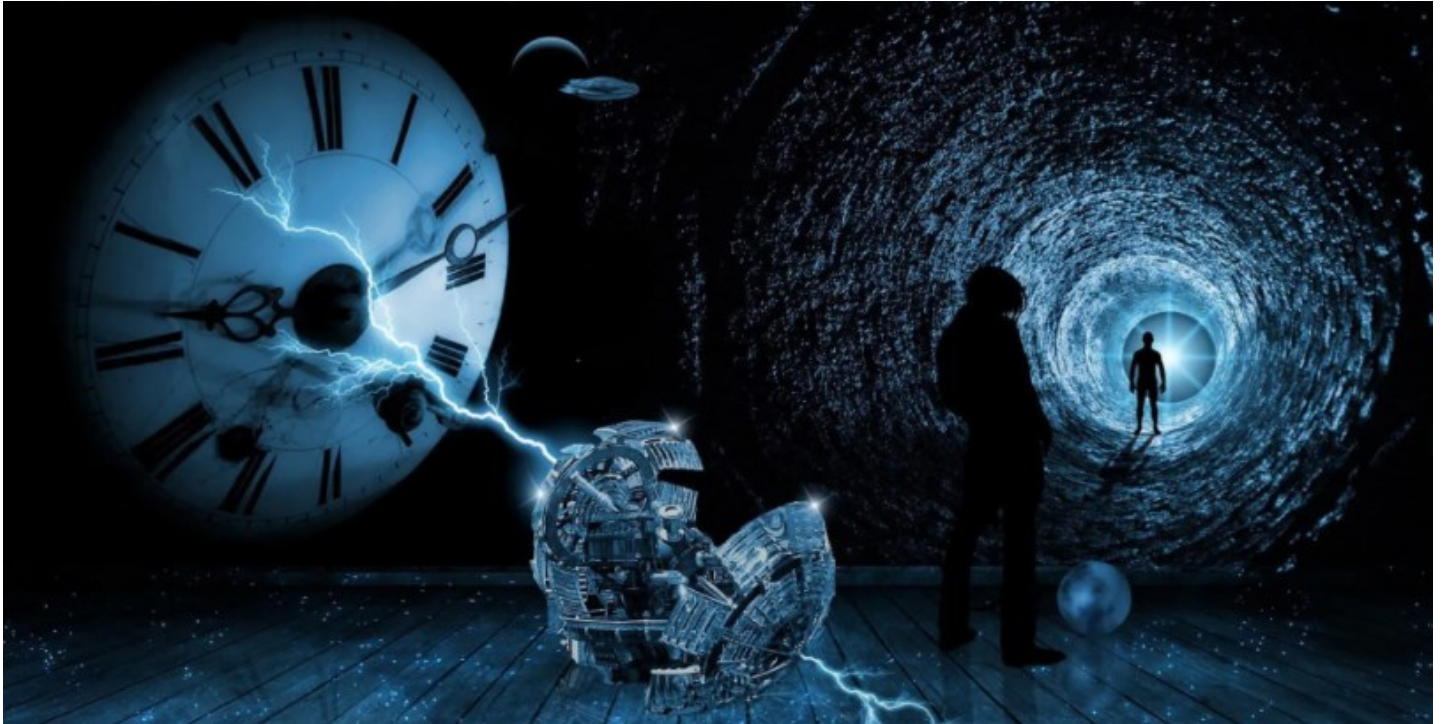


The Future

Career

What job would you like to have when you grow up? Draw a picture of you working in that job and write why you would like to have that job when you are an adult.



Aspiration Tree



Think about all the things you would like for your future. What would you like to be good at? Where would you like to visit? What would you like to do?

Draw some leaves and write each of your hopes for the future on a different leaf. Put them altogether on an aspiration tree!

Create a Time Capsule



A time capsule is something you make now and then hide away to look at again in the future. Create and decorate your own time capsule. Fill it with things that remind you of now, such as a newspaper clipping, a piece of string showing how tall you are, a piece of art work you have done, a sample of your handwriting, photographs, an empty hand sanitiser bottle, or anything else you can think of! Google has lots of ideas to help you. Don't forget to seal it up and hide it somewhere safe.



Junk Model Clock

Use junk-modelling to create your own clock.

Can you design it so that the hands move? What time can you make it?

Letter to My Future Self



Write a letter to yourself for you to read in the future. You can include a description of yourself now, your likes and dislikes, your friends and what you hope to achieve in the future. You can even ask questions about what your life as an adult is like.

Future School

What do you think school is going to be like for children in the year 2050? How will it be different to now? Pretend you are a child in 2050 and write a diary entry about what your school day is like.



Self Portrait



Create a portrait of yourself in the future. How do you think you will look different to how you look now? How will your clothes look different? Use paint, crayon, coloured pencil or pen.

Make a Robot



Many people talk about how robots will be able to help us in the future. What jobs could they do? What would you like a robot to do for you? Design a robot and make it using junk-modelling. Write a paragraph describing why your robot is special and what it can do.



Futuristic London



Lots of artists enjoy thinking about London will look different in the future. Will we have flying cars? What new buildings will be built? Could we take some buildings down to make more green spaces? Draw a picture of London now and another picture of how you think London will look in the future.



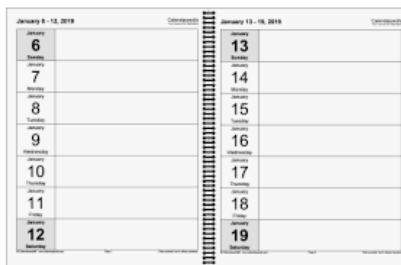
Be an Inventor

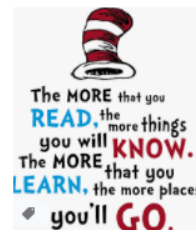
Life Skills

Dream Jar

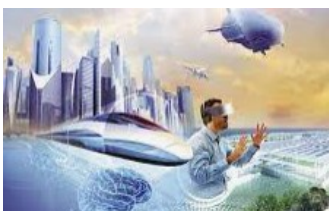


What is your ideal or perfect future? Write down your future dreams and put them in a jar. Decorate your jar with paint, glitter, coloured paper or anything else you would like!
