Cut out pictures of famous landmarks and make your own collage.

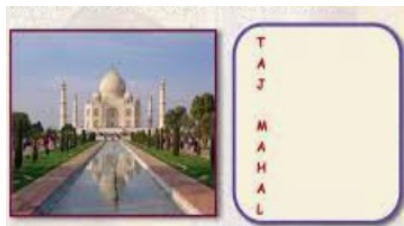


Favourite Landmark
